- 1. A. L. Kelson, auchter Eyen & Sziriro Sr. The major accomplishment of the fire district during the past year was the installation of approx. 515 ft. of transite pipe at the so. end of the system, replacing a quantity of old black iron pipe which had been in use for about 30 years, and some plastic pipe installed more recently. This line, serving ten patrons of the district, including the school, had been giving considerable trouble the last few years, and it was deemed very advisable to replace this section of main with 6 inch transite. The condition of the iron pipe, when it was dug up, revealed that, in places, it was almost completely filled up with rust and corresion. A fire hydrant was placed at the end of this line extension, providing more adequate protection to houses in the area.

Cost per running foot not incl. hyd. is \$5.20 per running foot.
Average costs for 6 inch line for water can be expected to be between
\$6 and \$8 per foot, according to Town Mgr. Burgess. We had one offer
from a contractor out-of-town to do the digging and laying of the pipe
for \$4.50 per foot, plus we to furnish everything. So we are quite
pleased with our cost figures per foot for the completed job, which
we feel was done at a low figure for the times.

We were very fortunate to have engineering advice and service furnished to us by Mr. Clem Wilkins of Stowe, Bert Moffatt, Bill Burgess and Dick Hedding of Randolph. All of these ment made several visits to our job, before, during and after the work, and provided us with invaluable information and service.

Our second major piece of work involved putting things in order at our source of water supply. On our last state inspection we were left with a long list of repairs to make at the spring and pump house in order to meet state approval. During last year we drained the spring house and repaired all cracks in the walls, put in new supports, repaired walls, roof and foundation, and put on new screening where needed, and painted the building. We also put a new door on the pump house, insulate the building so the chlorniator could operate in cold weather, installed a thermostat-controlled heater in the building, painted the building and the steel roof, and graded the land away from both the spring house and pump house, as per state recommendations. Our cash balance in the bank was completely used up in the year on the aforementioned expenses and it was necessary for the Pru. comm. to obtain another note at RNB, this time in the amount of \$1000. Somehow, we were able to persuade Mr. Dimmick to supply us with this money at only 4 1/2 per cent interest. At present our indebtedness stands as follows-all of it with the RNB. Bal. on note of 1964 \$500 4% Bal. on note of 1971 750 5 new note of 1972 1000 42%

Beside our regular income from taxes and water rents during the year, we sold to the So. Royalton Fire Dist. 10 pcs. of transite pipe at the current price of \$1.75 per foot, bringin us in \$210 of much-needed funds. This was pipe we were not going to need in the extension, and which we had paid \$1.43 a ft. for.

As per state requirement, we have been submitting two samples of water monthly from our distribution lines, and all reports hage come back a-1. Water during the past year has been supplied through the VTC system, and during the winter VTC lived up to its agreement with us and installed a new and larger booster pump, which is expected to go into operation this month. At this time we will again be pumping water from our own source, and we will have to chlorinate and sample daily.

The prud. committee has arranged with Jim Patneaude of VTC water dept. to take charge of the fire district pumping and sampling needs, as well as operating our chlorinator. This will relieve the Fire district of an important and necessary task, and will assure us of a trained operator in charge. We will be paying Mr. P. for his services, but at this time he has preferred to perform the duties for three months before determining what the charge will be.

Thus in the past year, we have made some large improvements to our water system, and have done much to put our house in order. Other work remains to be done. The extension of 6-inch line at the north end, and down the side street at the south end, are things which we should be planning for now. If we are to put ourselves in a position to financiall y afford these projects and meet the rising costs of operation and maintainnence, it seems imperative that we must consider increasing our charges to meet the costs. We should be building a reserve fund, as well as paying off our indebtedness. In order to do this the prud. comm. suggests that the present rate be raised to a \$10 base (from 8.60) and the overage charge be increased from \$150 to \$2. These rates will still pro-

vide us with our water at rates substantially below those in Randolph village. For instance, a family of 5 here will pay \$18 every 6 mo.s, as compared with 22.50 in Randolph. We would suggest increasing present commercial rates by an equal percentage amount.

As regards taxes, in view of the new and upcoming grand list we would suggest that the rate remain at .30. This will bring a larger yield form this source; how much we cannot guess at this time. However, after this year, we will have some idea as to whether we can lower this figure or have it remain the same or raise it.

We have had a remarkably good record of payments by water users and taxpayers during the year, and this is appreciated. As chairman of the prud. committee, I wish to thank Mr. Wheatley and Mr. Floyd for their cooperation and willingness to meet very often on short notice to handle business of the district. Also, our thanks to Mr.s Nelson our clerk, and Mrs. LaFrance, for their parts in helping to keep our fire district business running somoothly.
